COVID-19

As you are aware, there has been advice provided to schools regarding their operation as the NSW and Australian governments manage COVID-19. In line with this advice, the following school events at Barnier have been cancelled:

It is hoped that some of these events can be held at a later date. Decisions will be reassessed if the official advice changes.

Important Information

Students must stay home if they are sick. This is very important.

The health and safety of our students and staff is paramount. If your child is unwell with respiratory illness or any other type of illness, they must remain at home until symptoms resolve and, where appropriate, seek advice from a medical practitioner (and call ahead first).

If students are unwell at school they are immediately moved away from other students and sent home.

We have plentiful supplies of soap and paper towels in toilets and in classrooms. If students would like to bring their own hand sanitiser to use at school as an added precaution, please ensure that it is clearly labelled with their name and class. We have modified playground lining up procedures, recess/lunch eating procedures as well as school band activities. All classrooms and toilets are thoroughly cleaned every day. Students and staff are hand washing frequently throughout the school day and practising good hygiene within the school. We are implementing social distancing strategies across the school. School banking, scripture and library have been temporarily suspended.

Barnier will continue to precisely follow all departmental

advice and instructions. This may change as the term progresses. Please check Skoolbag regularly for notifications and updates. If parents or carers have any concerns or questions, please do not hesitate to contact If your child is or has been absent from school you me through the school office. I thank all parents, staff and students for their support and understanding.

Updated International Travel Restrictions

On 15th March, the Government put in place new measures for people arriving in Australia.

Individuals must self-isolate for a period of 14 days on arrival to Australia, including returning Australian citizens and residents. You are also required to selfisolate if you have been diagnosed with the COVID-19 or if you have had close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 infection.

Any student returning from overseas must not attend school for 14 days.

School Attendance

Regular and punctual attendance at school is absolutely essential for every student's academic progress and success. Students must attend school every day of each school term unless they are sick, injured or (possibly) infectious. It is not acceptable for any student to have time away from school for any other reason. In order to make the very most of every educational opportunity, students must be here at school to access differentiated and sequential, syllabusbased programs across all curriculum areas, the expertise of our teaching staff and the educational resources here at school. School attendance is also essential for each student's social, emotional and behavioural development.

In line with the Department of Education School Attendance Policy, family holidays and travel during school terms are no longer considered under 'Exemption from School Procedures'. Travel outside a school vacation period is counted as an absence from school.

Reasons for travel during school terms will not be approved unless they are in the best interests of the student's educational and social and participation needs.

Parents and carers must submit an Application for Extended Leave – Travel form and attach copies of all travel documentation such as travel itinerary and e-tickets. The application will be considered for approval in line with the DoE Attendance Policy. When travel period exceeds one school term access to Distance Education must be considered.

Skoolbag

The Skoolbag APP is the best and easiest way to stay up to date with school events, last minute notices, within the school. Specific attention to what needs to newsletters and all school communications. Skoolbag APP is free for parents. Simply search for the done across the school is critical to create a positive, APP in the APPLE APP or Google Play Store, sign up

in seconds using your email address and then select your school.

must notify the school as soon as possible to explain the reason why. The easiest way to do this is via the Skoolbag APP. Simply select eforms then Absentee Form, enter the details, sign using your finger and submit.

Positive Behaviour for Learning

Barnier is a PBL school. Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is an educational process that brings together the whole-school community to contribute to developing a positive, safe and supportive learning culture. The PBL framework assists schools to improve social, emotional, behavioural and academic outcomes for children and young people.

PBL is a process, not a program.

When PBL is implemented well, teachers and students have more time to focus on relationships and classroom instruction.

Students and staff benefit from:

- reduced problem behaviour
- increased time focused on instruction
- improved social-emotional wellbeing
- positive and respectful relationships among students and staff
- better support for teachers to teach, model and respond effectively to student needs
- a predictable learning environment where staff and students know what is expected to deliver effective practices that can be sustained over time.

PBL can be implemented in any school setting to support students from pre-school through to Year 12.

The PBL framework helps schools identify and successfully implement evidenced-based whole-school practices that enhance learning outcomes for children and young people.

The PBL framework can be used to strengthen the existing systems, structures and processes within the school which underpin the school's ongoing improvement and effectiveness. For example, the PBL framework encourages the use of school-wide data to identify patterns of problem behaviour, monitor student progress, reflect on teaching effectiveness and inform decisions that strengthen the learning.

Implementation of PBL requires the commitment of the whole school community and the support of the principal and executive teachers to lead the process The be done, how it is done and why it is being safe and supportive learning environments.

The key implementation aspects include:

- developing and using a common vision, language and experience to support PBL implementation
- clear expectations of students and staff
- collaborating with all staff to plan and implement PBL
- having at least 80% of staff willing to support
- developing a team approach with regular meetings
- creating, reviewing and revising a plan of action
- Collecting and using of data for decisionmaking.

We have implemented a number of strategies at Barnier that are data-informed and have been highly successful, examples of this are the explicit teaching of our expectations (respect, responsibility and resilience) across all school settings, free and frequent acknowledgement and reward of positive behaviour choices and changes to eating and playing times. Students now have supervised eating times at recess and lunch and 2X30 minute play periods instead of 3X20 minute play periods. This change has resulted in students properly and completely eating their recess and lunch before going off to play and a significant reduction in negative playground incidents which has been just wonderful to see.

Harmony Day

Special and heartfelt thanks to Mrs Andrews, Mrs Juleff and Mrs Putica for organising a spectacular Harmony Day on Tuesday 17th March. Despite having to postpone the assembly, community picnic and bilingual reading activities, we still ensured that all students participated in some very special, fun and enjoyable activities aimed at promoting the values and importance of Harmony Day.

Parent Complaints and Concerns

Occasionally parents or members of our school community may be concerned about an incident or issue or may have a complaint they would like addressed. Sometimes things do not go the way you expect. Sometimes the decisions made or the actions taken need to be explained better. At other times, we need to look more closely at what we did or how we are doing our work.

We would greatly appreciate all parents who have a complaint or concern to contact the school in a respectful and calm manner. I strongly encourage all parents to follow these procedures rather than venting on social media.

The school will always:

- encourage the resolution of problems wherever possible and always in a professional, respectful, supportive and calm manner
- ensure that concerns are addressed quickly, fully and fairly
- maintain good working relationships between all people involved with the school
- provide effective responses and appropriate redress
- be confidential and unbiased

It is very important for all adults to lead by example, for our children, with the way that they raise concerns, and also to model a respectful, positive and problem solving approach in these situations.

National Day of Action Against Bullying and Violence - Friday 20th March

Today is the National Day of Action Against Bullying and Violence. This has been acknowledged in classrooms across the school.

Bullying prevention is everyone's responsibility.

Every student, every staff member, every parent, carer and visitor on our school grounds has the right to be safe and to be treated respectfully and courteously. Bullying is not tolerated at Barnier Public School. I strongly encourage anyone who is bullied or who witnesses bullying on school grounds to report incidents immediately to a member of staff.
